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NAMC'S RESPONSE TO PETA'S CAMPAIGN TITLED 'CALL FOR BAN ON MOHAIR

GOODS'

It has come to the attention of the National Agricultural Marketing Council (NAMC) that there

is a video (4 minutes and 3 seconds) circulating, originating from Peta (People for Ethical

Treatment of Animals). The video presents an undesirable treatment of animals within the

shearing shed environment.

The undesirable treatment of Angora goats cannot be condoned by the NAMC under any

circumstances and the industry should identify the shearing shed and put measures to

remedy the situation. Ethical Trade is a practice or business culture that is championed by

the NAMC. Therefore, the Mohair Industry is urged to correct all the negative treatment of

animals that is shown in the video.

When we look at the video we observe that the treatment may have happened in one or two

shearing sheds and yet the message communicated is as if that is a common practice.

Farmers, in South Africa, have serious attachments to their livestock that make them treat

their animals with respect as they derive their livelihoods from them. The Mohair Industry

contributes significantly to the country's foreign earning (South Africa is the world leading

producer of mohair globally and a huge exporter).

The transformation activities of the Mohair Industry are also starting to show some

significant gains with black farmers starting to participate in the mainstream of mohair

production. The Industry established a Trust Fund to finance a number of projects to assist

black farmers in order to transform the industry.

A call to ban mohair goods by Peta is harsh as the eventuality happened on few sheds,

however, should be seen by the industry as an eye opener. As part of Civil Society

community, PETA has to play an advocacy role and it would be good if they had indicated

that their video was taken from a specific shed that has to be corrected (rather close exports

from the shed than the country). The NAMC does not condone ill treatment of animals.

The NAMC has close working relationships with the Mohair Industry and would engage them

directly to ensure that this unnecessary practice is rooted out of the shearing sheds. The

NAMC would like to caution the audience of the video in that, it was taken from a specific

shed that is not a true reflection of the whole industry.

The Mohair Industry is a valuable industry to the socio-economic condition of many lives and

the Karoo environment and needs not to be subjected to such a harsh treatment as called

by PETA for a practice that can be corrected.
