
S ince 2014, the NAMC through the Y Agriculture collaborated with the various agricultural industries, conducting career awareness, providing bursary funding, and work experience placement.

In 2016, the NAMC invited her to the Youth in Agriculture programme launch in Pretoria, where she became more inspired. The event motivated her to work harder and ignited a greater passion for her to start a side business in agriculture.

In 2018, she participated in DHET's student competition for students in entrepreneurship, where she received a cash prize as second-place winner. She then registered her MUCO Farming Enterprise and built some infrastructure, proceeds from her own pockets.

Khodani graduated with BSc in Agricultural Economics in 2021 and is presently enrolled at the University of Venda, pursuing a Master's degree in the same field.

She recently bagged an opportunity to study for a master's degree in Applied Economics at the University of Bath in England, United Kingdom.

"I believe that combining the two master's degrees will enable me to forecast and make predictions about future opportunities regarding efficient production within the agricultural sector at any level, based on theoretical and econometric models." she added.






