

## POST: ADVERT: RE-ADVERT: TWO MINISTERIAL REPRESENTATIVES (2) TO SERVE ON THE BOARD OF CITRUS INDUSTRY TRUST (CIT)

The Agricultural Regulatory Measures Division of the National Agricultural Marketing Council (NAMC) plays a vital role in ensuring effective communication between the Agricultural Industry Trusts and the Minister of Agriculture. A key responsibility of the Division in relation to the Trusts is to manage the appointment process of Ministerial Representatives to these Trusts, thereby promoting sound governance and supporting sector transformation objectives. This announcement relates specifically to Citrus Industry Trust (CIT) and serves to initiate and guide the appointment of a Ministerial Representative to this Trust.

### OBJECTIVES OF THE BOARD OF THE CIT:

- Finance basic and applied research relating to the production and marketing of citrus,
- Grant bursaries or financial aid to persons in the furtherance of their studies relating to the citrus industry,
- Finance the collection and dissemination of marketing and other information relevant to the citrus industry,
- Finance and nurture marketing skills in the citrus industry,
- Finance the promotion of the citrus industry in a national context and especially overseas,
- Finance mechanisms for the social development and welfare of all directly affected groups in the citrus industry including labour,
- Finance any organisation or institution that has as its aims one or more of the above objectives; and
- Promote the aims of the citrus industry by providing financial aid.

### QUALIFYING CRITERIA TO SERVE AS A MINISTERIAL REPRESENTATIVE:

- Be a citizen of the Republic of South Africa;
- Possess the ability to analyse and interpret financial statements and investments;
- Have a minimum of five years' experience in the fields of agriculture, land reform, and rural development;
- Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the government's transformation policies;
- Show a strong desire to advocate for and advance the interests of smallholder farmers in the citrus industry;
- Not be an immediate family member of, nor have any business affiliations with, members of the National Agricultural Marketing Council (NAMC);
- Possess excellent teamwork and leadership skills, with the ability to work effectively as a member of a team;
- Be willing to accept the duties and responsibilities of a ministerial representative;
- Have an understanding of agricultural Trusts, statutory measures, and their objectives.

### RESPONSIBILITIES OF MINISTERIAL REPRESENTATIVES:

- Ministerial Representatives have a legal obligation to take shared responsibility for the Trust in which they represent the Minister on, and must ensure that;
  - The Trust pursues its objectives as outlined in the Trust Deed;
  - The assets of the Trust are protected and used exclusively to pursue its objectives;
- The Ministerial Representatives should be available for the meetings and report to the NAMC regarding the key issues discussed and decisions taken during the meeting;
- Report to the NAMC regarding activities of PIDT on a continuous basis; and
- Ensure that the assets of the Trusts are utilized in a manner that is consistent with objectives of the Trust Deed and the Marketing of Agricultural Products Act (MAP Act).

### TERMS OF MINISTERIAL REPRESENTATIVE:

The term of the Ministerial Trustees is three (3) years. Ministerial Trustees may serve a maximum of two consecutive terms, and the reappointment is subject to their performance and commitment in the first term. Ministerial Trustees who have served for two consecutive terms will not be eligible for reappointment.
